The front door is a beautiful Chadlington design with bespoke arched astragal bars, finished in a classic and elegant green shade known as 'Fortnum' combined with a 'White' frame and set off with black ironmongery. The rear entrance door is the Rawlinson design in a colourway to match the front door.

"The final finish of the windows and doors is very special, including all the bespoke carpentry around them. Noise reduction is significant, and heat loss has been hugely reduced. They look superb!"
